Office of waste reduction

Campbell

Representatives Campbell, Hudgins, Hunt, Chase, and Morrell

Changes the name of the department of ecology's office of waste reduction to the office of waste reduction sustainable production. Directs the office to: (1) Prepare and submit a biennial progress report to the legislature; (2) Work with federal, state, and local agencies and private organizations administering programs related to pollution prevention, energy consumption, resource consumption, the use and generation of hazardous substances, or the generation of waste or pollution; (3) Administer a waste reduction and safer chemical alternatives research and development program; (4) Establish and maintain a database of chemicals used in the state to help meet the 2021 toxic chemicals use reduction goal; and (5) Consult with the department of health regarding the health effects of toxic chemicals and safer chemical alternatives.

Residential real property

Williams

Representatives Williams, Dunshee, Nelson, Simpson, Moeller, Hasegawa, Chase, Roberts, Kirby, and Appleton

Declares that: (1) For Washington's families, purchasing a new home is both the greatest investment they will make and the culmination of their dreams; (2) Those making the very significant investment in a new home should receive genuine accountability in return and should not be expected to bear, particularly on top of the heavy financial burden of a mortgage, the costs of homebuilder negligence; (3) Those citizens purchasing new homes or remodeling their homes receive statutory warranty rights similar to those purchasing condominiums; (4) Anyone purchasing a home within six years of its construction, including purchasers subsequent to the initial owner-occupant, be entitled to the common law implied warranty of habitability to ward against egregious defects in the fundamental structure of their homes, and intends that this warranty cannot be contractually waived; and (5) As a matter of public policy the common law warranty of habitability applicable to newly constructed residential real property should be modified to extend greater protection to home purchasers.

Takko

Representatives Takko, Orcutt, Condotta, and O'Brien

Changes the schedule for revaluation of taxable real property. Requires the department of revenue to assist any county assessor requesting assistance in the valuation of industrial property estimated to exceed twenty-five million dollars in real and personal property value. Requires the department of revenue to administer a grant program to assist counties with the schedule change. Creates the annual property revaluation grant account. Makes appropriations. Provides that sections 3 and 4 of the act expire July 1, 2014. Provides that the act is null and void if appropriations are not approved.

House Finance (originally sponsored by Representatives Takko and Alexander)

Authorizes a county treasurer to: (1) Begin collection of certain taxes and assessments once the treasurer completes the yearly tax roll; and (2) Use a verification of payment rather than a stamp to show evidence of payment of the real estate excise tax. Makes payment dates for diking, drainage, and sewerage improvement district assessments the same as for property taxes. Changes the requirement when property tax refund claims must be made.

Disqualifies an individual from unemployment compensation benefits beginning with the first day of the calendar week in which the individual has been discharged due to absence from work resulting from either a violation of law for which the individual was convicted and sentenced to jail or prison, or a violation of a condition of probation, community custody, community supervision, or parole for which the individual was incarcerated in jail or prison.

SHB 1360**Residential infrastructure****Ormsby**

House Local Government & Housing (originally sponsored by Representatives Ormsby, Orcutt, Simpson, Smith, Dunshee, Springer, Lias, Upthegrove, Eddy, Takko, Chase, Morrell, Moeller, and Sullivan)

Creates the residential infrastructure program in the department of community, trade, and economic development to provide loans to eligible jurisdictions and grants to nonprofit organizations for public infrastructure that supports increased capacity for dense, affordable residential development in transit-proximate areas. Requires the department of community, trade, and economic development to determine each year the total amount of funding available in loans and grants and establish the total amount of financial assistance to be appropriated to eligible jurisdiction and nonprofit organization applicants based on certain criteria. Creates the residential infrastructure account. Directs the state treasurer to, by August 31, 2010, and by August 31st of every year thereafter, transfer from the general fund into the residential infrastructure account the lesser of fifty million dollars or the excess real estate excise tax growth amount.

Finds that when government or a private corporation exercises its power of eminent domain by condemning private property, the condemnation process causes hardship on the property owner that goes beyond the financial loss of the property. While property owners receive fair market value as compensation for their condemned property, this payment does not compensate property owners for the additional hardship they undergo during the condemnation process. This additional hardship includes the harm created when a condemning authority condemns property and then does not use the property for the intended purpose or for another public purpose, and then sells the property to a private individual or entity. Declares an intent to provide property owners with the right to repurchase their condemned property if it is not used for a public purpose and is sold by the condemning authority within seven years after the property was acquired through or under the threat of condemnation. Provides that the act applies to condemnation proceedings commenced on or after the effective date of the act.
